

Warrant of Arrest

The Commonwealth of Kentucky,

To the Sheriff, Constable, Jailer, Marshal or Policeman in the State of Kentucky:

It appearing that there are reasonable grounds for believing that

Arthur Sexton

has committed the offense of pulling down and removing fence dividing the land of Mary Irena Curd and the land occupied by Arthur Sexton, and permitting his, the said Sexton, to enter upon the land of said Curd and eat and consume the grass thereon, the 9th day of Oct 1920 19

You are therefore commanded to arrest said Arthur Sexton

and bring him before me to be dealt with according to law.
