

The Commonwealth of Kentucky,

To the Sheriff or any Constable of Mercer County:

Whereas B. F. Roach hath made

complaint to me as Judge of the Mercer County Court, that

Lige Preston

did on the 1st day of April 1916, forcibly

detain from him a house and lot on the Lexington pike in what is known
as Stringtown, Kentucky, bounded as follows:-

Bounded on the North by Wilbur Peters; on the South by Harrison Goodloe;

and on the East by B. F. Roach

which was in the peaceable possession of said Lige Preston now holds
against him as tenant.

You are therefore commanded to summon the said Lige Preston

to appear at the Court House in Harrodsburg, Ky., to answer on the

28th day of April, 1916, the charge

of forcible Detainer aforesaid, and give to the said

at least three days' notice of the time and place of the trial, and have then and there this writ.
