To the Sheriff or any Constable of Mercer County:

Whereas John I. Vandersall, bath made complaint to me as Judge of the Mercer County Court, that

James T. Ingram, did on the 14 day of April, 1916, forcibly

enter upon the following described property, a house and lot on west side of main street, in Harrodsburg, Kentucky, adjoining the property known as the Racket Store and J. O. Deelman on the west by Ingrams Garage on the North by Lexington street and on the East by Main Street, in the County of Mercer

which was in the possession of the said John I. Vandersall and his tenants Tom Adkisson and Mrs. Lizzie Britton, which the said Ingram now holds against them. You are therefore commanded to summon the said James T. Ingram to appear at the Court House in Harrodsburg, Ky., to answer on the

15 day of April, 1916, the charge of forcible Detainer aforesaid, and give to the said Ingram at least three days' notice of the time and place of the trial, and have then and there this writ.
