To the MERCEUR QUARTERLY COURT:

W.F. Rogers, and John Larkin, state that Benjamin Clemmons died

a resident of Fayette County, Kentucky, on or about the 19th day of April 1915, intestate; that by an order of the Fayette County Court, duly entered, they were appointed, on the 24th day of April 1915, the Administrators of said decedent; that at the time of the death of the said decedent, he was the owner of a certain farm consisting of about 440 acres of land in Mercer County, Kentucky, known as the John Forsythe farm, which place is located on the Harrodsburg & Bloomfield turnpike, about five miles Northwest from the city of Harrodsburg; that at the time of the death of said decedent, and ever since, said farm has been in the possession of and under rent to Walter C. Forsythe; that said Walter C. Forsythe.
