

THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY, TO THE SHERIFF OF MERCER COUNTY:-

Clell Coleman and Citizen's Bank of Burgin, Ky having made complaint to me, that W. R. Chase and M. L. Bunnell, doing business as Chase & Bunnell and also as the Burgin Packing Co, being one and the same, did on the day of March 1915, forcibly detain from them, the following

property was in the peaceable possession of the said parties Burgin Pack

ing Co, Chase & Bunnell and W. R. Chase and M. L. Bunnell, as the tenants

of Citizens Bank of Burgin, Ky and Clell Coleman, but which they now hold

against the owners and landlords thereof, and refuse to surrender to

them; you are therefore commanded to summon them to appear before me on

Friday April 2nd, 1915 at 10 a.m. at the Court House in Harrodsburg, Ky

at which time inquiry will be made, and a trial held as to said forcible

detainer, and you will have then and there this writ with the manner in

which you have executed the same.
