

VILLAGE TO FETE 150th FOUNDRING

Washington, Historic Town in Mason Co., Marks Sesqui-Centennial On June 3.

Plans for the observance of the sesqui-centennial of the founding of Washington, historic Mason county city, are rapidly nearing completion. It was announced by Mrs. Arthur S. Best, of Maysville, president of the Washington Study Club, which is sponsoring the event.

The observance, denoting the 150th anniversary of the founding of Washington, a village of approximately 400 population, will be conducted June 3 and one of the features of the celebration will be the unveiling of a tablet by the Kentucky branch of the National Society of Colonial Dames.

The tablet will be inscribed as follows: "Washington, Kentucky, Established as a Town in 1786. Distributing Postoffice for the Whole Northwestern Territory, 1809. Erected by the National Society of Colonial Dames."

The tablet will be placed at the curve on U. S. highway No. 65, which in the early days was a part of the old Zane's Trace, the first macadamized road in the United States.

The village of Washington, it was pointed out, is one of the richest spots in Kentucky history. The town is six years older than the commonwealth of Kentucky, having been established by the Virginia legislature as a municipality in 1786.

In Washington was located the first postoffice west of the Alleghenies and still standing in the town is the historic old Marshall home, where, some historians claim, Harriet Beecher Stowe conceived the idea for her now famous book, "Uncle Tom's Cabin."

The birthplace of Albert Sidney Johnson and the place where "Uncle Tom" was sold are two of the outstanding historic places of interest which those attending the sesqui-centennial celebration may visit.
