

VILLAGE TO FETE 150th FOUNDING

Washington, Historic Town in Mason Co., Marks Sesqui-Centennial On June 3.

Plans for the observance of the sesqui-centennial of the founding of Washington, historic Mason county city, are rapidly nearing completion. It was announced by Mrs. Arthur S. Best, of Maysville, president of the Washington Study Club, which is sponsoring the event.

The observance, denoting the 150th anniversary of the founding of Washington, a village of approximately 400 population, will be conducted June 3 and one of the features of the celebration will be the unveiling of a tablet by the Kentucky branch of the National Society of Colonial Dames.

The tablet will be inscribed as follows: "Washington, Kentucky. Established as a Town in 1786. Distributing Postoffice for the Whole Northwestern Territory, 1809. Erected by the National Society of Colonial Dames."

The tablet will be placed at the curve on U. S. highway No. 68, which in the early days was a part of the old Zane's Trace, the first macadamized road in the United States.
