The plaintiff, George Martinon, states that on the 2nd day of February 1926, the defendant, Bill King, executed and delivered to him his certain promissory note for \$150.00 with interest at the rate of 6% from date and due and payable in 30 days from date. He says that simultaneously with the execution and delivery of said note he executed and delivered to this plaintiff a chattel mortgage on the below described property to secure the payment of said note. Property described as follows, viz:

Three Ford one ton trucks, now licensed in the name of said King and owned by him; also, a lot of household and kitchen furniture now stored in store house of Chas. White & Co., in Burgin, Ky.; also, the household furniture for three rooms now stored in n, Ky.

He says that as past due and unpaid and he ought to recover thereon said amount with interest as aforesaid. Note filed here with.

He says that this is an action for money due upon a contract; that it is just, due, and unpaid and that the defendant is a non-resident of the State of Kentucky and now absent therefrom.

Wherefore plaintiff prays for a judgment against the defendant in the sum of \$150.00 and interest from 2nd day of February, 1926, until paid and the costs of this action and for a general order of attachment against the property of this defendant and that he be adjudged to have a lien on said mortgaged property to satisfy said judgment and for a judgment for a sale of said property to satisfy said lien and judgment and for
