The Plaintiff, The Fort Harrod Motor Co, says that it is a corporation created under the laws The State of Kentucky, and is authorized to sue and be sued, contract and be contracted with, and to conduct the business of selling automobiles and engaging in the general Garage business, under and by its Corporate name, "The Fort Harrod Motor Co"

The Plaintiff, states that on December 16th 1926 the defendant, Roy H. Scroghan executed and delivered to him a certain promissory note, for \$20.00 due on or before February 16th 1927, with interest at the rate of 6% per annum until paid.

Plaintiff states that the note is credited on 1/15/27, with a payment of \$10.00 and that that is the total that has been paid on said note.

Plaintiff states that this defendant is also indebted to him the sum of \$4.00 balance on an account, that the goods for which this account is due were delivered to this defendant at his special request, and that defendant agreed to pay for same when they were delivered by this plaintiff, it states that said goods were delivered in 1928.

Wherefore plaintiff prays for a judgment against this defendant in the amount of \$10.00 on note with the further amount of \$1.27 interest ###### which is interest from January 16th 1927. Also for judgment for \$4.00 for his costs of this action and for all relief to which he may be intitled.
