Another of Harrodsburg's missing National Guardsmen, captured by the Japanese at the fall of Bataan in April, 1942, was accounted for when Mrs. Gladys Foster, of this city, received a notice from the War Department stating that her son, Pvt. Willard E. Foster, died June 2, 1942, of The body was buried dysentery. at Camp O'Donnell, the notice said.

Private Foster was 19 years old at the time of his death. He was a member of the Berea Christian church in Mercer county. Survivors, besides his mother, are two sisters and one brother, Mrs. Loraine Heidl, Dayton, Ohio; Mrs. Maxine Parker, Harrodsburg, and Arthur C. Foster, Seaman 1/c U. S. C. G., who is serving with the Navy in the Pacific.
