Plaintiff, Cogar Grain & Coal Company says that it
is doing a general business in the city of Harrodsburg-Ken-
tucky and was so doing at all times herein mentioned.

Plaintiff says the defendant Ed. Sallee is indebted

to them in the sum of \$ 99.37 with interest thereon from this
date until paid; that the consideration of said indebtedness is
for good, wares and merchandise sold and delivered to this defend-
ant at his special instance and request and for which defendant
promised and agreed to pay. Plaintiff says that although often
demanded defendant has failed and refused and still fails and
refuses to pay all or any part of said indebtedness and that the
whole of same is now ~~xxx~~ due and owing.

Plaintiff says that this is an action for the recovery

of money due upon a contract; that the defendant has no property
in this State subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy
plaintiff's demand and that the collection of said demand will be
endangered by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property

found.

Wherefore plaintiff prays judgment in the sum of \$ 99.37

with interest thereon from April 30th 1937 until paid; for a general
order of attachment against defendant's property and for all further
relief they may appear to be entitled both legal and equitable.
