The plaintiff, Bell Hain, states that she is the wife of the defendant, W. E. Hains, having been married to him on the day of 19____, and that they have one infant child about months old.

She states that about the 8th day of June, 1914, the defendant, with whom she was then living in Harrodsburg, Ky., abandoned her and left this state, ~~carrying~~ taking with him all the estate of which they were possessed except a very small amount of house furniture, and a ^{growing} garden crop, consisting of corn, tomatoes, onions, peas, potatoes and other vegetables on a ten acre lot on the South side of the Southern Railway right of way in the eastern part of Harrodsburg, Ky., leaving behind no other property, or money except ten dollars, which the plaintiff has expended for labor on said crop. ~~She~~ She states that by reason of these facts she has nothing by which she can support herself and child and at present must depend upon the charity of her neighbors and other citizens of Harrodsburg. She says that said crop, by proper cultivation and with a good season, will yield between two and three hundred dollars, but that she is unable to pay for labor to cultivate the same and bring it to maturity, and that she is physically unable to do it in person. She states that said crop is in need of immediate work and attention and unless immediate ^{action} be taken to care for or dispose of the same, the entire crop will be lost, and she will be left penniless. She states that the defendant has removed himself and a material part of his property out of this state, and that she is without support
