Plaintiff further says that the defendent is about to dispose of and has disposed of his property for the fraudulent purpose of cheating, hindering and delaying his creditors- Note filed herewith and made a part hereof-

Wherefore plaintiff prays fir a judgment against the defendent in the sum of \$93.00 with interest thereon from date until paid and all the costs of this action and for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendent and for all relief to which he is or may appear to be entitled-- special, general and proper-
