### MURDERER OF AGED NEGRO FIRST TO DIE FOR CRIME

The first white man to go to his death in the electric chair in Kentucky for the slaying of a Negro was pronounced dead by physicians at the state penitentiary at Eddyville shortly after midnight Thursday.

Erline Whitehead had been in prison more than a year and had been ill most of the time. He was electrocuted for the murder of John Allen, an aged Barren county Negro. Prior to his execution Whitehead told Warden Wilson that he was ready to die in the chair. He also told Warden Wilson that he was guilty of the slaying but that he "didn't think he got a square deal." He refused to talk about the crime.

### DIDN'T LIKE U. S.—LEFT

With his wife, two governesses, three military aides and six children, grizzled General Jorge Martinez, commander-in-chief of the Colombian Army, arrived in Manhattan. He set out to see some friends, was stopped by an elevator strike. He started to go shopping, was drenched in a downpour. He went to the theatre, lost two of his offspring. Sputtering General Martinez ordered nine rooms on a transatlantic liner, sailed for Europe in disgust.


