The Plaintiff, E.G. Guttery, states that the Defendant,

William Johnson, is indebted to him in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY FOUR DOLLARS (\$174.00), balance due under rental contract for real property in Mercer County during the years 1921 & 1922 $\frac{1}{2}$, which Defendant, with his family, used and occupied during said years, and for which the Defendant promised and agreed to pay the sum named above, no part of which has been paid. Plaintiff says that the monthly rental charges under said contract, making up the sum total of \$174.00, are just and reasonable, and Defendant has, within the last year, promised to pay said sum to Plaintiff. Plaintiff files said account herewith as part hereof marked "G" for identity. Wherefore, Plaintiff prays judgment against the Defendant for the sum of \$174.00, for his cost and all proper relief.

Affiant, E.G. Guttery, states that he is Plaintiff in the foregoing action; that the nature of his claim is as stated above; that is, for rent of real property, due and unpaid; that it is just, and that he believes he ought to recover of the Defendant the sum of \$174.00, and his cost herein expended. He further states that the Defendant has no property in this state subject to execution, or not enough thereof to satisfy Plaintiff's demand, and that the collection thereof will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and return of no property thereon. Wherefore, he prays for a general order of attachment against the Defendant's property, and asks that the City of Harrodsburg be summoned as garnishee herein, and disclose any money or property due from it to the Defendant.
