The defendant, Mercer Loose Leaf Warehouse, answering the plaintiff's petition, denies that at any time the defendant John Hellard delivered to it any tobacco. It denies that any tobacco owned by the defendant Hellard was sold over the loose leaf floor at Defendant's ware house. It denies that it received or sold any tobacco in which the said Hellard had any interest. It denies that any tobacco in which said Hellard had any interest to the defendant's knowledge was sold over its floor. It denies that any tobacco was delivered to it in the name of the said Hillard. It denies that it has or had any knowledge that the said Hillard had any interest in any tobacco sold over its floor.

Paragraph 2,

The defendant reaffirming and readopting all denials in the first paragraph, for further answer to the plaintiff's petition and as a cross petition against Phil Lyons, who is a necessary party to this suit, says :

That the said Phil Lyons did deliver to it a crop of tobacco raised on his place in the year 1926, but that said tobacco was delivered in the name of Phil Lyons who claimed the sole ownership thereof and that said tobacco was sold by it for the said Phil Lyons and the proceeds thereof paid to the said Phil Lyons : that as to whether or not the said tobacco delivered to it by the said Phil
