Plaintiff states that the reasonable worth of the Victrolia is worth is \$25.00 and the reasonable worth of the shaft and wheel of the spring wagon is reasonably worth \$10.00 ; that said property is wrongfully detained by defendant and was not taken for a fine or tax against plaintiff or under any order or judgment of a court against her nor seized under an execution, distress warrant or attachment against her property .
