The plaintiff, J. H. Hanna, states that in the years 1918, 1919, 1920, 1921 he sold to the defendant, Fred Starling goods and merchandise at his special instance and request of the value of several hundred dollars and that said account has been credited by the payment by the said defendant at various times and amounts until now the balance due on said account is \$107.65, the last payment on said account being made on the 15th day of September, 1921, of \$3.00. He says that the said balance due is just, and that he ought to recover thereon said amount and that said sum is due to him as an action for money due upon a contract and that the defendant has no property in this State subject to execution or not enough there of to satisfy plaintiff's demand and the demands of the defendants and that the collection of said demand will be endangered by obtaining a judgment against the defendant of no property found. He also states that he has paid the costs of this action and that he is entitled to a judgment against the defendant for the same.
