Plaintiff, Charles Hedges states that the defendant, William League is indebted to him in the sum of \$36.50; that said amount is the balance on an account which the defendant has promised to pay from time to time; plaintiff has made demand upon defendant for this amount but he has failed and refused to pay said amount or any part of same.

Plaintiff states that this is an action upon a contract, being a contract to pay money; that the account is just, that he believes he should have and recover the full amount of the account sued on, to wit, \$36.50, together with cost of this action; that defendant has no property in this state subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy and pay said indebtedness, and the collection of this demand will be endangered by the delay in obtaining judgment, and return of no property found.

WHEREFORE, plaintiff prays judgment against defendant for the sum of \$36.50, for costs of this action, for general order of attachment against property of this defendant, including a summons against the garnishee, Harvey Vandivier, who
