## Two Veterans Rejoin U. S. Army At Danville

The re-enlistment of two area residents in the U. S. Army, through the Danville recruiting station, was reported today by T-Sgt. Fred M. Lawson, who pointed out that one of the men was a prisoner of the Japanese, after the capture of Bataan, for 42 months during World War II.

This re-enlistee is Lonnie Lee Gray of Harrodsburg, who was taken by the Japs at the fall of Bataan with other members of the famous 192nd Tank Battalion many of whom were Mercer countains.

Enlisting for three years, in the grade of corporal, Gray was assigned to the Engineer Corps at Fort Ward, Wash. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Floyd Gray of Burgin.

The other re-enlistee at this time is Lester Harold Simpson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Coleman Simpson of 609 Oak street, Danville.

Young Simpson served in World War II with Co. B, 255th Infantry Regiment. He was re-enlisted in the grade of private first class.
