

Warrant of Arrest

**The Commonwealth of Kentucky,**

To the Sheriff, Constable, Jailer, Marshal or Policeman in the State of Kentucky:

It appearing that there are reasonable grounds for believing that

**Harry Martin,**

has committed the offense of  
unlawfully with intent to defraud, did utter a check on the  
Farmers National Bank of Danville, Kentucky, knowing at the time  
there was no funds to pay same.
