The plaintiff A.B. Teater says that the defendant Hugh Leach is indebted to him in the sum of Ninety Seven Dollars and Eighty Cents (\$97.80) for goods, wares and merchandise which the plaintiff sold and delivered to the defendant at his special instance and request and for which the defendant promised to pay plaintiff; he says that said account is just, due and unpaid and that he has demanded payment of same but that the defendant has failed and refused to pay said account; he says that he believes that he ought to recover said amount from the defendant with interests and costs of this action and that the defendant has no property in this State Subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy the demand of plaintiff and demands of defendants creditors and that the collection of claim will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found.

Wherefore plaintiff prays for a judgment against the defendant Hugh Leach for the sum of \$97.80 with interest, for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant, for his costs herein and for whatever relief he may appear entitled to.
