--VS-- STATEMENT.

L. GARDNER,

DEFENDANT.

The plaintiff Albert Hatchell states that on the 28th, day of September, 1925, the defendant L. Gardner executed and delivered to him his check on the State Bank and Trust Company of Harrodsburg, Kentucky, his check for the sum of \$25.00; he says that he presented said check to said Bank and it refused to pay same for the reason that the the Defendant had no funds in said bank to pay said check; he says that by reason of the said Bank refusing to pay said check that the defendant is indebted to him in the sum of \$25.00, with interest thereon from the 28th, day of September, 1925, until paid and that said check was given to him by the defendant for a good and valuable consideration. He files said check as a part hereof marked "A". He says that said amount of \$25.00, is just, due and unpaid and that the defendant has refused and failed to pay same.

He says that the defendant has removed or is about to remove his property or a material part thereof, out of this State, not leaving enough thereof therein to satisfy the plaintiffs claim or the claims of the said defendants creditors and that he has sold, conveyed or otherwise disposed of his property, or suffered or permitted it to be sold with the fraudulent intent to cheat, hinder or delay his creditors; he says that the defendant is now a non resident of the State of Kentucky, and is now absent therefrom and that to the best of his knowledge and belief his present post office address is Bethalto, Ill, Box, 107; he files a copy of said check herewith as a part hereof. Wherefore plaintiff prays judgment against the defendant L. Gardner for the sum of \$25.00, with 6% interest thereon from the 28th, day of September,
