The Plaintiff J.G.Teater says that the defendant William Phillips is indebted to him in the sum of Sixty Two Dollars and Twenty five cents, with 6% per annum interest thereon from June, 30th, 1921, evidenced by the defendants certain promissory note which he executed and delivered to the plaintiff and by the terms of which he promised and agreed to pay plaintiff the sum of \$62,25 one day after date of June, 30th, 1921 and bearing six per cent per annum interest from date and he files said note herewith as a part hereof.

Plaintiff says that said note is just, due and unpaid except the sum of \$10,00 paid Nov, 7th, 1921 and \$15,00, paid June, 9th, 1922.

Wherefore plaintiff prays judgment against the defendant William Phillips for the said sum of \$62,25 with 6% per interest thereon from June, 30th, 1921, till paid, subject to the above named credits, for his costs and whatever relief he may appear entitled to.
