The plaintiff, C.R.Leonard, states that on the 5th day of August, 1920, the defendant, J.K.Smiley, executed and delivered to him his certain promissory note for the sum of \$150.00 due and payable in 6 months from date thereof and bearing 6% interest from date until paid. He says said note is long past due and unpaid though payment has been repeatedly demanded. The reason the note is not filed is that it is in bank as surety for borrowed money. It will be filed if requested. He says that this is an action for money due upon a contract and that it is just; that the defendant has no property in this State subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy plaintiff's demands and the demands of the defendant's creditors and that the collection of the said demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining a ^T judgment and a return of no property found.

Wherefore, plaintiff prays for a judgment against the defendant in the sum of \$150.00 with interest thereon at the rate of 6% from August 5, 1920, and for all the costs of this action and for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant and for all relief to which he is or may appear to be entitled.
