

The affiant S. L. Ransdall states that he is a resident of the County of Mercer and State of Kentucky, and that on the day of April 1915, he was a license keeper of a Jack which was located and being in said County of Mercer at his place of residence and he further states that on the above date above stated that said Jack was allowed to serve two mares belonging to W. R. Currens and that there was two Horse mule colts folded one to each mare belonging to the said W. R. Currens, same being the get of said Jack.

The affiant further states that the said W. R. Currens agreed to pay to him said S. L. Ransdall the sum of \$8.00 each for the season of each of the aforesaid mares.

The affiant further states that the said W. R. Currens sold and delivered the two aforesaid horse mule colts to one Leonard Smith without his knowledge or consent.

The affiant further states that the time allowed by law to enforce said lien upon said get which is allowed by section #2503 ~~Section~~ Article V of the Kentucky Statutes has almost expired and he makes this affidavit to the County Judge of Mercer County for the purpose of a warrent to be issued and a levy made upon said get for the payment of the sum of \$16.00 and all costs of said action.
