Bacteria Have Most Rapid Growth

Bacteria are capable of the most rapid growth among living organisms. Under most favorable conditions a single bacterium can develop more than 1,000,000,000 descendants in twenty-four hours. Each individual will split in half and the halves grow to full-size individuals in about fifteen minutes. A colony of a billion bacteria is the standard used in testing the efficiency of germicides and disinfectants, says the American Institute of Sanitation. They are rated on the number of bacteria killed and the speed with which they kill them.

Naming Dog River

The Dog river is a short distance from Beirut, Syria. The name is derived from the great stone dog, or perhaps Assyrian bull, that once stood on the height overlooking the mouth of the river and the sea. The dog's head was hollow and when the wind blew from a certain direction the dog used to emit howls, to the terror of the surrounding population. The most valiant of these at length summoned up enough courage to push the gigantic dog over the edge of the cliff into the sea, where it is visible at low tide.
