This case coming on to be heard and the Court being advised is of the opinion that the plaintiff is entitled to the relief sought in it's petition, it is therefore ordered and adjudged that the plaintiff, the Geo. Bohon Co. recover of the defendant.-P.T. Williams \$110.28 with 6% interest thereon from July 1st, 1915 until paid and its cost herein expended.

It is further ordered and adjudged that to secure the payment of said note, interest and cost, it has a lien upon one brown gelding, 6 years old, called Prince and one suckling Shetland pony called Teddy. It is ordered that the plaintiff is entitled to have said property or so much thereof as is necessary to pay said debt, interest and cost, sold.

Upon motion it is ordered that Chas. T. Corn be and he is hereby appointed Special Commissioner for the purpose of selling said property, Before making said sale, he will advertise the time and place thereof by posting handbills containing the discription of the property to be sold, amount of debt interest and cost and place of sale at three public places in the vicinity of the residence of the defendant and one at the Court House door in Harrodsburg, Ky. for 15 days next preceeding the date of sale. He will sell said property on the first day of some Circuit or County Court day held in and for said County.
