He admitted slaying his wife because he "wasn't satisfied with life."

Surviving besides his mother and two half-sisters, Mrs. Minnie Anderson of Lancaster and Mrs. Raymond Crossfield of Anderson county, is a sister, Miss Aileen Houchin, of Lawrenceburg, and a half-brother, Warren Houchin, of Anderson county.

SENATOR COUZENS TAKEN BY DEATH

Death, brought on by uremic poisoning, was fatal to Senator James Couzens, 64 years old, senior Senator from Michigan, last Thursday. Senator Couzens had recently accompanied President Roosevelt on his tour of Michigan. He was stricken suddenly and died on the operating table without regaining consciousness.

A former partner of Henry Ford, his vast fortune came from the success of the billionaire motor manufacturer's dream. Couzens died after his bid for nomination to a third term in the United States Senate had been discarded by the Michigan electorate in favor of a younger man, former Governor Wilber M. Brucker.


