KY. FARMERS TAKE 'GAMBLING CHANCE' ON TOBACCO

The other day Tom Middleton, tobacco expert of the department of agriculture accused Kentucky tobacco growers of taking "a gambling chance" on their crop every year. Asked to explain what he meant, Mr. Middleton said:

"Curing is about the most important factor in getting a crop that will bring a good price on the market. No matter how good a crop is at the time it is housed, it can be made very common by careless curing."

The expert also pointed out that there is a difference between drying and curing. Said he: "When moisture escapes from the leaves too fast it merely dries them, and when it escapes too slowly it sweats and causes house-burn."

"How can the curing properly be done?" was queried of the agricultural expert. "When tobacco is first placed in the barn," he replied, "moisture must be taken from the leaves at a certain temperature to obtain the best results. Tests show that the ideal conditions for curing at this stage is when the temperature in the barn is between 75 and 95 degrees Fahrenheit."

Johns

The Johnes family of County Shropshire, England, was granted the above coat of arms in 1610. Another branch of the family, who settled in County Berks, also used the same arms.

Edward Johnes sailed from Yarmouth, England, with Winthrop's fleet in 1629, and settled at Charlestown, Mass., the following year. His father also came to America several years later and settled in the same town. Another member of the Johnes family was Sir Francis Johnes, Lord Mayor of London, in 1620.

Edward Johnes held many posts of political importance in his adopted country, and in records is described as a man of birth and means.

While the spelling of this name was originally Johnes, the American descendants usually spell it Johns.

Description of Arms: The upper portion of the shield gold, the lower part blue with three gold crosses and a lion rampant.

Crest: A lion supporting an anchor.

Motto: Conquer evil with good.

"CHESS PIE"

1 cup milk
1 1/2 cups sugar
4 egg yolks
1/2 cup butter or 1 cup cream
1 pound seeded raisins
1 1/2 cup chopped walnuts
1 teaspoon vanilla

Scald milk. Add sugar gradually to well beaten egg yolk. Add cream or melted butter; pour scalded milk over the egg mixture. Cook fifteen minutes in double boiler. Add raisins and chopped walnuts. Cook ten minutes more and cool filling. Line pie tin with rich pie crust, and put in filling. Cover with top crust and bake about 25 minutes.

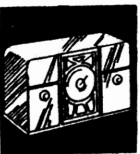
Smallest Known Mammal

Politics Often Blamed For Panics

Depressions Have Always Followed Wars In Same Sequence In U. S. History.

It is human nature to place the blame for hard times and give the credit for good times to whatever political party happens to be in power when times are hard or times are good. A great historian, James Truslow Adams, has recently pointed out how fallacious this line of reasoning is. Panics and depressions, he points out, always follow war and have followed war in the same sequence from the beginning of our national history. Immediately after a war there is a short period of hectic prosperity, followed by a short period of depression, after which is a period of wild speculation and then a great depression.

That happened after the Revolution. The final crash came when Washington was President. The economic curve from 1783 to 1791 was almost exactly like the curve from 1919 to 1929.

After the war of 1812 the same thing happened; the crash came in 1819. There was a similar sequence after the war with Mexico. The brief prosperity of the North after the

war between the states was followed by a short depression, a speculative wave and then a financial crisis in 1873 with a depression that lasted until 1879. We went through a similar cycle after the war with Spain, and a severe depression followed the bank panic of 1907.

Everyone old enough to read remembers that in 1919, and early 1920 after the World War there was a great boom of prosperity. Then a depression which lasted until 1922, then a great speculative wave which came to an end in 1929 and we are only just beginning to climb out of the seven years' depression which followed that collapse.

It is difficult, in the light of such historical records, to believe that politics or political parties are always to blame.
