as Garnishee

Charlie Jones, Debt

Comes Claud F. Bunton, and for his answer herein as garnishees, states that the defendant, Charlie Jones is indebted to him in a balance of account as his tenant for the year 1921, in the sum of \$456.10. That the said indebtedness arose for provisions, cash and house rent furnished the said Charlie Jones, in the said year of 1921; that the full amount of the said defendant's indebtedness to this garnishee was \$627.00, and that he received from first distribution of cash from sale of said defendant's tobacco by the Burley Tobacco Growers Marketing Association the sum of \$170.90, leaving balance as aforesaid. That all of said provisions, rent, cash, etc., furnished to the said Caharlie Jones by this affiant, were furnished by him in the year 1921, and for the purpose of enabling the said defendant to raise his crop of tobacco and for sustenance for himself and family during the said year; and that he has a superior lien upon said crop and the proceeds thereof for its payment, by reason of being land-lord to the said defendant, Charlie Jones.

WHEREFORE, having answered herein, he prays to be dismissed with his costs, and for judgment for the balance of his debt, as aforesaid.
