

Private Leonard Prisoner Of Japs

**Perryville Boy
Had Been Missing
Since Nov. 1941**

Private Hugh J. Leonard of Perryville, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jackson M. Leonard, is a prisoner of the Japanese in the Philippine Islands, it was learned today.

Reported missing from Harrodsburg were Private Stanley H. Kyler, grandson, of Mrs. Martha H. Devine; Private First Class Charles E. Reed, son of Charles Reed; and Corporal Edward V. Trisler, son of William Harvey Trisler.

Private Leonard, a volunteer member of the 192nd Tank Division of the United States Army, left for military service on November, 1941, and no word was heard concerning him until the recent message from the War Department announced his capture, Mr. Leonard said.

The 27-year-old soldier is a former student of Perryville high school.

A brother, Second Class Gunner Mate, Ben Leonard, volunteered for service with the United States Navy four years ago, and was wounded at Pearl Harbor.

He is believed to be cruising in Pacific waters.

He is also a former student of Perryville high school and resident of that community.
