Business Tops Last Year Trade

Review of Work in Progress in Many Sections of Kentucky By State Dept. Commerce.

With retail trade throughout the country moving at higher levels than during the corresponding period last year, wholesale stepped out with definite indications of a substantial upturn in Fall trade, according to Department of Commerce reports from 37 cities for the past week just received by its Louisville District Office. Reports from the various industrial centers gave evidence of sustained activities in most lines. Transportation facilities continued to be taxed heavily to take care of the vast tourist trade which was apparently moving at higher levels than at any time in recent years. In the New York wholesale markets, buying was said to be brisk with Fall orders being booked at rates well beyond that of last year.

The Louisville district reported seasonable weather was responsible for best gain in retail business of year, vacation supplies, electrical appliances and wearing apparel in record demand. Effect of drought not yet noticeable in wholesale orders, demand now running as high as 30% over year ago.

National Reemployment service placed 1,504 during week.
Bank clearings 27.2% over same week of 1935.

Tobacco, in all districts, responding meely to rain and prospects for good crop greatly improved, good deal of dark crop already been "topped." Rains have put new life into growing crops throughout district.

Contract for \$40,000 concrete bridge over I. C. Railroad at Bardwell, let by State Highway Commission.

Swift & Company opened new cheese factory at Russellville, to handle 500,000 pounds of milk per month.

Glass bricks, capable of transmitting 75% light being used for first time in construction work in Lexington in new engineering plant of University of Kentucky.

Barbourville bank reports deposit increase of \$110,000 since January 1st.

Hail and high wind damaged crops in Hopkins county to extent of \$25,000.

County of Jefferson purchases former well known hotel for \$25,000 to provide additional quarters for official use.

Danville firm awarded concrete bridge over Salt river at bid of \$12,358.

Sum of \$7,957,859 was expended in schoolhouse construction in Kentucky past year, either in new buildings or repairs.

New water plant completed at Midway at cost of \$60,000.

Nashville, Tenn., firm awarded contract for new bridge in Hardin county, Ky., at cost of \$17,880.

100-patient hospital under construction at Lackey, Floyd county, by Dr. W. L. Stumbo, at cost of \$75,000.

Owensboro firm awarded contract for construction of concrete highway approach to gold bullion depository at Fort Knox at cost of \$5,900.

\$40,000 set aside by State Highway Department for construction of detour road from Shelbyville to Louisville.

Minneapolis contractor low bidder at \$1412,000 on low-rent housing project in Lexington planned to house 286 families.

Installation of water works system at West Point to cost \$50,000 approved.

Flour milling company plant destroyed by fire at Sacramento, Ky., with loss of \$25,000.

Increase in collection of premiums in Kentucky by all classes of insurance companies, reported at \$3,300,000 over preceding year.

Louisville distilling firm of Dant & Dant increases working capital from \$300,000 to \$500,000. Dowling Bros., distilling company, Burgin, also increased from \$172,000 to \$233,000. Superior Construction Company, Lexington, increases working capital from \$20,000 to \$100,000. Maysville pays L.&N. railroad \$12,000 for old depot to provide site for viaduct.

Jeffersonville, Ind. reports collections 20% better than month ago. May bank debits 14% greater than last month and year ago.
