

It reminded me of the taxicab strike in New York, of which my wife and I received our first news from screaming headlines in the newspapers of Hongkong, China. We sent cablegrams back to our family. They replied that, being busy, they hadn't read the papers and didn't know there was a strike.

I am a great admirer of newspapers, but the years have taught me a certain calmness. Very often I have discovered that things are not always so bad as they are printed.

KY'S TOURIST BUSINESS

Decoration Day is the first of the summer holidays on which Central Kentucky plays host to large numbers of tourists from other states, and reports from the hotels and from the headquarters of the Blue Grass Automobile Club indicate that out-of-state visitors over the weekend were even more numerous than in 1935.

So large was the demand for rooms that one leading Lexington hotel reported it was compelled to turn away all who applied after 8 o'clock Saturday night.


A Sunday afternoon drive of a few miles on any of the main highways leading out of Lexington was all that was necessary to convince residents of this community that the number of visitors from other states represented one of the largest totals in the history of the Blue Grass. Traffic was extraordianly heavy, particularly on the Georgetown road leading to Cincinnati, and it seemed that at least half the cars bore out-of-state licenses.

All roads leading to Lake Herrington, where fishing was resumed early Monday morning after a 31-day closed season, were jammed, and Glen Weinman, secretary of the automobile club, reported that his office received numerous inquiries for information regarding the horse farms.

More and more, Kentuckians are realizing that the tourist is one of the commonwealth's most important enterprises. Tens of thousands of dollars were spent by visitors from Ohio, Indiana and other states in Kentucky, and particularly the Blue Grass region, during the Decoration day holiday. With its many matchless scenic and historic attractions, the extent to which the business is developed, depends entirely on the enterprise of the citizens of the state.

Some Money Taboo

A friend says he was fortunate in his first employer, who was a wise and upright man. Because his enterprises had a habit of turning into profit, all sorts of opportunities were laid on his desk. He could pick and choose. Whenever a proposal was made which touched the ethical border-line, he never hesitated. He would say firmly: "There are some kinds of money you're not supposed to make."

My friend, who is something of a philosopher, says that this remark has saved him much loss and trouble, and he offers three suggestions as to money you and I are "not supposed to make."

1. You're not supposed to make money on your home. It is possible, of course, to buy or build your home at a time when real estate values are favorable. But the chances for enhanced values should not be the important factor in the plan for a home. It is your home it's not a money making proposition.

2. You're not supposed to make money by borrowing on your life insurance. Occasionally a man has been able to finance a profitable undertaking by a temporary loan on his policies, but if the history of all life insurance loans were written it would be a tragic narrative.

3. You're not supposed to make money without work. The men who suffered worse in the stock market crash were not investing; they were grabbing. They were not trying to lay up a reasonable surplus for their declining years. They were trying to make a clean-up so they "wouldn't have to work."

You agree with these three comments. Do you think it would be a good thing if every class-room and office wall could have painted on it the old man's warning: "There are some kinds of money you're not supposed to make?"

NEW HEART DRUG  
(Pathfinder)

Dr. K. K. Chen, of Indianapolis, recently reported the discovery of a new heart drug many times more powerful than digitalis. It is said to also have other advantages over the latter drug in that it is cheaper and can be injected directly into the bloodstream instead of being taken into the system through the mouth. The isolation was made from be-still or yellow oleander nuts which grow in Hawaii and India and, according to Dr. Chen, one nut contains enough of the drug for five human injections. When tested on thirty-five heart patients, some of whom were in a serious condition, it was reported as having produced "extremely satisfactory" results.

## USE OF PEAT COMPULSORY

Use of peat fuel is to be made compulsory in the Irish Free State. Coal dealers will be obliged to dispose of a certain amount of turf with each ton of coal sold. No unregistered person may sell coal and on no may purchase it from an unregistered dealer. The penalty will be \$5 for each ton or fraction of a ton.
