The plaintiff, T.H.Carter, states that on the 12th day of September, 1921, the defendant, Bowman Taylor, executed and delivered to him his certain promissory note for the sum of \$76.50 with interest thereon at the rate of 6% from date until paid and due and payable on January 1, 1922. He says that to secure the payment of said note with all interests and costs thereon the said Bowman Taylor executed, acknowledged, signed and delivered to this plaintiff a mortgage on the following described personal property To- Wit: One Yellow Jersey Cow, named Nell, 6 years of age and with horns; One Brindle Cow named Jane, 8 years of age and a mooly; said cows are now in the possession of the said Bowman Taylor and free from any other incumbrance so far as known to plaintiff.

Wherefore plaintiff prays for a judgment against the said Bowman Taylor in the sum of \$76.50 with 6% interest thereon from the 12th day of September 1921 until paid and for all the costs of this action. He asks that he be adjudged a lien on the two cows described herein to secure the satisfaction of such judgment as is obtained in this action and for all other relief to which he is or may appear to be entitled -- Special, general and proper. He asks for a sale of said cows to satisfy said lien.
