

Sergeant Quinn On Way Home?

Staff Sgt. Charles Quinn, Dayton survivor of Bataan, Corregidor and two and a half years in a Japanese prison camp, has been released from Letterman General hospital in San Francisco and should be on his way home, according to a press

report today.

But his family, who were told that he would go to his former home in Harrodsburg, Ky., before coming to Dayton, haven't heard from the sergeant in several days so they don't know when to expect him here.

Meanwhile his mother, Mrs. Carrie Quinn of 311 Morton avenue, left for Harrodsburg yesterday morning to see another son, Cecil, who is leaving for the Army today.

In a telephone conversation with him last night Dayton members of the family learned that Lt. William Gentry, who was with Sergeant Quinn all through the Philippine ordeal and at Letterman hospital, has already returned to his home in Harrodsburg.
