

Harrodsburg Pair Back From Philippine Prison

Harrodsburg, Ky., March 29 (AP)—Two more Harrodsburg men who were among those liberated from Japanese prison camps in the Philippines have returned to their homes here.

Staff Sgt. Charles Quinn and Cpl. Field McLeod "Jack" Reed, Jr., who were freed from Camp Cabanatuan, are visiting their families and relatives. Capt. William R. Gentry arrived home March 16. The three, members of the Harrodsburg tank company which fell with the capitulation of Bataan and Corregidor, had been prisoners of the Japs for three years.

Sergeant Quinn, the son of Mrs. Carrie Quinn, who came here from Dayton, Ohio, to be

with her son, is visiting a brother, Cecil Quinn, and a sister, Mrs. Dave Collier.

Corporal Reed said he would spend ten days with his wife and two children and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Field McLeod Reed, Sr., before reporting at Nichols General Hospital, Louisville.

Two other liberated Harrodsburg men have not yet arrived home. They are Pfc. Reid Shewmaker, now in a hospital near Denver, Col., and Pvt. Garrat Royalty, who has not arrived in the country.
