The plaintiff I. C. James says that on the first day of September 1907 he contracted and agreed with the defendant George Shirley to hitch the defendants horse for his family and school children in plaintiffs Livery Stable and for said hitching the defendant promised and agreed to pay plaintiff the sum of Eight Dollars per year. Plaintiff says that from the first day of September 1907 and during the months of January, Febrary and March of 1918, he furnished and provided hitching room for the defendants horse for his family and for his school children and which hitching room was used and enjoyed by the defendant and for which he is indebted to this plaintiff in the sum \$90.00, and he files herewith a statement of account as a part hereof marked "A".

Plaintiff says that said \$90.00 is just due and unpaid except for a credit of \$46.50 for straw which the defendant furnished the plaintiff at various times.

Wherefore plaintiff prays judgment against the defendant George Shirley for the sum of \$90.00 subject to a credit of \$46.50 with interest thereon, for his costs herein and for whatever relief he may appear entitled to.
