The Plaintiff, Homer Yates, states that on the 4th day of Sept, 1913, he and the defendant executed their certain promissory note to the George Bohon Compant, whereby they agreed and promised to pay to said Company the sum of \$119.22 with interest from Jany 1st, 1914. He states that said debt will not become due until Jany 1st, 1914 and that on said note and debt this plaintiff was the surety for the defendant.

He states that said defendant is about to sell, convey or otherwise dispose of his property for the purpose of cheating, hindering and delaying his creditors and this plaintiff, and to compel this plaintiff to pay said George Bohon Company, the above described note, unless he is prvented from selling said property by order of Court.

He prays for his costs and all proper relief.
