## An Odd 'Birthday' Of Chick's Heart

24th Anniversary That It Has Been Kept Alive And Beating Since 1912.

A short time ago one of the strangest of all birthday anniversaries was celebrated—the 21st anniversary of a bit of muscle from an embryo chick's heart, which has gone on beating and living and growing in a test tube ever since 1912.

This is the famous bit of tissue kept alive by Dr. Alexis Carrell at the Rockefeller Institute. It lives in a specially prepared culture, and every now and then Dr. Carrell has to snip little bits off of it to keep it from growing too big. It has lived four times as long as the life-span of an ordinary chicken, and there seems to be no good reason why it should not go on indefinitely.

It gives us a creepy feeling, somehow, the thought of this blind, mutilated and soulless bit of animal matter pulsing its way through a seemingly endless existence. What is life, anyway, that a scientist can so casually imprison a fragment of it in a little glass tube? What is death, that is can be defeated so easily?

As you might expect, Dr. Carrell's studies of this curiosity have led him to make some odd speculations. He has suggested, for instance, that the only reason why men and women cannot live forever without bodily deterioration, is the fact that they have brain cells. Cells in ordinary tissue can multiply and replace themselves indefinitely; brain cells cannot; hence we are mortal and not deathless.

Future generations may look back on this whole experiment as one of the most important of all of mankind's undertakings. Who knows what discoveries may come from it; what new understanding of the secret of longevity and disease; what new theories by which men can assure themselves longer lives and more complete growth?

But it is futile to speculate about these things. They are topics for the specialists; they are beyond our understanding. We can only gaze at the experiment itself, and indulge in those queer spinal shivers that come when we are confronted with a mystery that is utterly beyond our understanding.

## PEAS

### Partial to Parties

MODERN parties are taking a new slant. The guests do the cooking. Erstwhile parties were notable for guests being guests and hosts being hosts. In fact so busy was the hostess for days before the party, in order that the guests might be served without lifting a finger, that it was not unusual to be entertained by a weary hostess.

### It's Different Today

Perish the thought. Today the guests do the work—and like it.



Try giving a party where every guest prepares at least one dish. It's really good sport, and good eating. Be sure that you have plenty of canned peas on hand, for you'll be surprised how many people will say that their own particular "crackerjack" culinary performance calls for peas. Peas are partial to parties.

If you have some patty shells or pastry cases on hand and would like to supply a recipe for a guest who is racking his brains for something to make, here is a good suggestion:

**Party Peas in Pastry Cases:** Make a white sauce of two tablespoons butter, two tablespoons flour, three-fourths cup evaporated milk and all of the liquor from one No. 2 can of peas and one 2-ounce can of mushrooms. Season with salt and pepper. Add the peas and the mushrooms and also one-fourth cup of shredded pimiento. Reheat and serve in pastry cases, or in small patty shells. This serves six persons.

## Routing The Fish Along A New Way

Salmon Will Have To Be Steered In to Another Channel Because Of Coulee Dam.

Columbia River salmon, on their up-stream migrations, will meet with what appear to be insurmountable obstructions. The Indians, whose traditions, for generation, have centered about Columbia River salmon predict that this means the end of the run. But the white man has planned otherwise and concrete construction is matched by plans for getting the fish up-stream.

When the fish enter the Columbia on their way to their spawning grounds their first obstruction will be the Booneville Dam. At this point \$3,500,000 is being expended to help them over the dam. Expert fishery engineers have perfected general plans which will provide for collection traps where the hordes will be steered into the quiet waters; and fish locks and fish ladders where they will be steered over the dam.

Having passed this hurdle they will travel many miles west and north until at the Rock Island Dam at Wenatchee, they will again be persuaded, not to attempt to leap the great sheet of dam water, but to proceed wisely to either side and swim and leap up the succession of steps known as fish ladders.

On again, and having gained experience, they will swim upstream but probably never will actually reach the Coulee Dam. The height of the dam will be far too great to make ladders practicable and the only way will be to halt the fish below the dam and collect them into ponds for spawning and propagation. The Washington State Department of Fisheries and the United States Bureau of Fisheries are working out extensive plans to this end.

A plan similar to this has been successfully worked out at the Ariel Dam on the Lewis River above Portland.
