The plaintiff, John H. Tyler, states that he and the defendant, Flen Freeman, own and live on adjoining farms; that a part of the division fence between them belonging to defendant is not a lawful fence; that about the first of this month a fine young steer of the value of \$55.00 belonging to this plaintiff got over the fence of the defendant into the defendant's field; that the defendant carelessly, negligently, wrongfully and tortiously run said steer over or against the fence, or struck and beat him with rocks, clubs, or other hard substances and thereby broke the leg of the said steer and rendered said steer worthless and of no value in the damage to this plaintiff in the sum of \$55.00.

Wherefore plaintiff prays for a judgment against the defendant in the sum of \$55.00 and for all the costs of this action.
