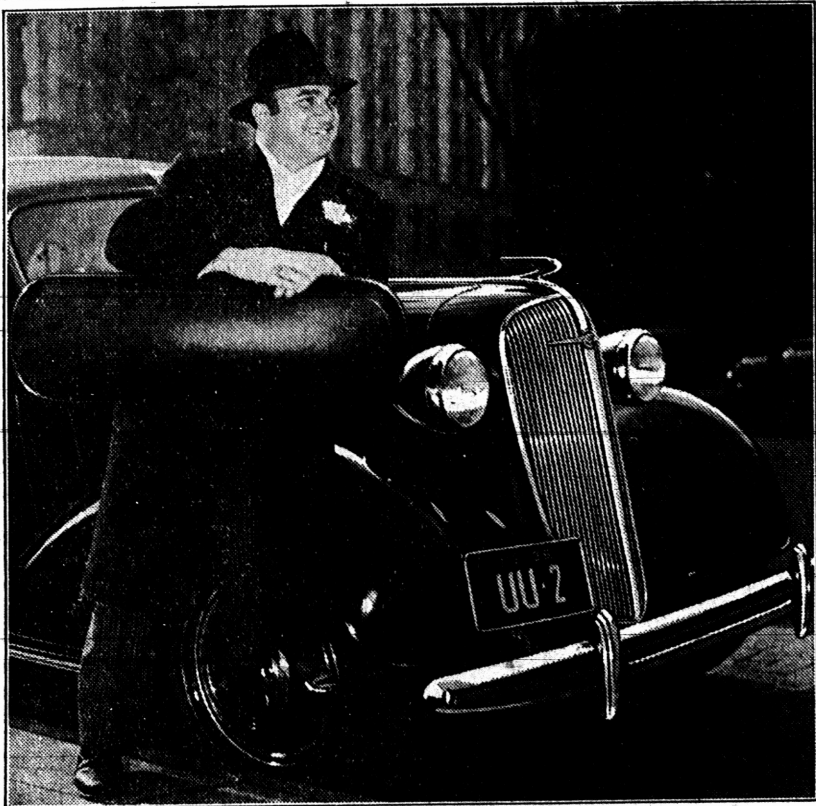


Rubinoff Holds World Record for Broadcasting



Rubinoff and his violin—and Chevrolet—are a combination that few, if any, radio listeners in the United States have not received in their homes via the air. The famous violinist and his Stradivarius, stars of the Chevrolet Musical Moments programs, have the distinction of going on the air from more broadcasting stations than any other program in the history of radio. Three hundred and seventy-eight stations broadcast Rubinoff three times a week, a total of 1134 fifteen-minute programs. That figures out at 283 hours, and if one week's programs were broadcast one after the other day and night, it would require 11 days. The illustration shows Rubinoff, carrying his precious violin, posing with his car after a special appearance at Detroit.

Merger Methodist Churches Favored

Unification Of Various Branches Of Faith Vote By Conference, 470 to 83.

The general conference of the Methodist Episcopal church was committed Monday to a program of unification with other Methodist branches to form the world's largest Protestant body—a Methodist church

having 8,000,000 members in 42 countries.

Conference delegations voted 470 to 83 to approve the program of union with the Methodist Episcopal church, South, and the Methodist Protestant church after their leaders visioned in pleas for the merger the possible union of all Protestant churches into a single denomination.

The unification proposal goes now to the annual conferences of the Southern church and the Methodist Protestant church, with final ratification possible in 1938 at the general conference of the Southern church. The Methodist Protestant general conference convenes May 20 at High Point, N. C.

AN ORDINANCE

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Harrodsburg, Ky.

Section 1

That no person or persons shall sell, or offer to sell, or demonstrate for sale either with delivery of possession or by taking orders and later delivering possessions, any goods, wares, merchandise or property of any kind, or practice the arts of Phrenology, Hypnotism, Clairvoyance, or Fortune Telling, in the City of Harrodsburg, Kentucky, without first having secured a license so to do. Such license shall be granted by the City Manager and shall not be less than Three (\$3.00) Dollars, nor more than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars per day, nor less than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, nor more than Two Hundred-Fifty (\$250.00) Dollars per year, to be determined by said City Manager at the time of granting the same, from the following classifications. All license fees to be turned into the General Expenditure Fund of the City.

Classification "A" \$3.00 Per Day
 Ball Throwers Rack, Book and Magazine Agents, Vacuum Sweepers, Pitchmen selling small non-competitive articles, Skating Rink, Street or House to House Photographers, Sewing Machine Agents.

Classification "B" \$10.00 Per Day
 Phrenologist, Hypnotist, Clairvoyant, Fortune Teller, Jewelry, Fruits and Vegetables, or any other competitive merchandise, except articles exempted by law.

Classification "C" \$25.00 Per Day
 Clothing, Furnishings, Shoes, Millinery, Furs, Fur Coats, Rugs, Carpets, Draperies, Furniture, Hardware, Stoves, or any other competitive merchandise, except articles exempted by law.

Section 2

Provided that this Ordinance shall not apply to bona fide Merchants of the City, nor to Raisers or Producers of farm and garden products, selling their own products, nor to sales under order of Court; but in all cases the burden shall be on the defendant to show that he comes within this exception.

Section 3

Any person or persons who shall violate any of these provisions shall be fined not less than Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars, nor more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, for each offense and each day shall be a separate offense.

Section 4

All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
