The plaintiff, Andy Carey, states that on the 26th day of October, 1918, the defendant, Albert Tyler and John Tyler, executed and delivered to John Tyler, their certain promissory note for the sum of \$100.00 with interest from date and due and payable in 1 year from date. He says that on the 3rd day of November, 1919, the said Albert Tyler paid on this note the sum of \$50.00 and that there has been no other payment made on this note.

He says that defendant, Albert Tyler, has no property in this State subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy plaintiff's claim and that the collection of said claim will be endangered by delay in obtaining a judgment and a return of no property found to satisfy same. That defendant is about to sell or otherwise dispose of his property for the fraudulent purpose of hindering, defeating and delaying this plaintiff in the collection of said claim.

Wherefore he prays for a judgment against the defendant, Albert Tyler, in the sum of \$100.00 with interest thereon from the 26th day of October 1918 subject to a credit of \$50.00 paid the 3rd day of Nov- 1919 and for all costs of this action and for all relief to which he is entitled including a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant-
