The plaintiff, E. H. Gaither, not waiving his right to plead orally further states:

That in 1927 the defendants, being then sued by the Burly Co-operative Marketing Association in the Mercer Circuit Court, employed this plaintiff, who is a regular practicing attorney at this Mercer County Bar, to defend said action for <sup>they</sup> them/agreed and promised to pay him for his services in said defense the sum of \$50.00; that he did defend said action to its conclusion but that the defendants have neglected, failed and refused to pay the plaintiff any part thereof; that his services were concluded at the January term 1928 and that his fee was then due

Wherefore the plaintiff prays judgment against the defendants and each of them for the said sum of \$50.00 with interest thereon from Feb. 1, 1928; he prays for his cost and all proper relief.
