

Upon motion of D.R. Terhune, Esquire which was duly carried, it is ordered that the Court proceed to consider bids and costs of erection bridges over Chaplin river, as well as over Buchanan creek.

Upon motion, which was duly carried, it is ordered that the bid of the

Empire Bridge Company, for the erection of a bridge over Buchanan

Creek on the Fox Creek pike at the price of \$797.00, be and same is

hereby accepted. Said Bridge to be erected according to the Blue Print

marked "B" which is filed herewith and as set out in bid which is filed

herewith marked "C". The said Bridge to be erected and completed by

Novr 1st, 1914 and constructed of the best material.

It is further ordered that the bid of Lud Cornish for the erection of the

masonry for said bridge ~~be accepted~~ at \$6.00 per cubic yard and making

of fill at said bridge at .25 cts per cubic yard be and same is hereby

accepted.

The Committee heretofore appointed, is authorized to sign contract with

said parties on behalf of the Fiscal Court and file same for record with

the Clerk of this Court.

Those voting for the said motion being Esquires, Burgin, Black, Norton,

Smalley, and Whitehouse and Esquire Terhune voting against same.

Esquire D.R. Terhune, moved the Court that the bid of the Empire Bridge

Company of \$4160.00 for the erection of a Bridge over Chaplin river

complete be accepted, which motion was duly seconded by Esquire E.R. Norton,

when upon a vote upon said motion, Esquires Terhune and Norton voted for x

said motion and Esquires Smalley, Black, Burgin and Whitehouse voted against

said motion, and same was thereupon declared lost.

be rejected.
