That the said party of the first part, to secure the payment of a certain promisory note dated Feby. 7th., 1919 and due Jan. 1st., 1920 for the sum of ~~\$24~~ \$246.80 less a payment of \$20.00 March 7th., 1921, with interest from May 18, 1920 at 6% and note for \$548.58 dated Oct. 14, 1916 less payment of \$227.76 Feb. 18, 1919 with interest at 6% from Feb. 18, 1919, hereby grants, sell and mortgage unto the party of the second part the following described property, to-wit;

Six acres of tobacco on farm of Phil Royalty known as the Oliver Meredith place.

To have and to hold ~~unto~~ said property unto said party of second part, their successors and assigns forever provided nevertheless, that if the said party of the first part shall pay or cause to be paid on or before ~~the~~ the 1st. day of Jan. 1922 the indebtedness aforesaid together with all interest and costs that may accrue thereon then this mortgage is null and void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect.
