The plaintiff, Hugh Caruthers, says that on the 20th day of October, 21, he obtained a judgment in the Police Court of Harrodsburg, Ky. for \$60.00 and interest thereon at the rate of 6% from date until paid, *against* and the costs of said action amounting at that time to \$12.00, against the defendant, B.M.Britton. He says that on the 20th day of November, 1921, he had issued to the county of the defendant's residence and placed in the hands of Clel Coleman, sheriff of said County, an execution which is in words and figures as follows, Viz:

## EXECUTION FOR DEBT-

TO THE SHERIFF OF MERCER COUNTY:

We command you that of

the personal estate of B.M.Britton, you cause to be made the Sixty(\$60.00) Dollars and no cents, which Hugh Caruthers, late in our ~~Court~~ Harrodsburg Police Court, recovered against him for debt, with interest thereon at the rate of 6% per annum from the 23rd day of August, 1915, until paid; also, \$12.00 for costs herein expended, whereof the said defendant was convicted, as appears to us of record; and that you have the said sums of money before the ~~paid~~ ~~Court~~ Judge of said Court on December next, to render unto the said plaintiff the debt, interest, and costs aforesaid, and have then and there this writ.

Given under my hand as judge of said Court, this 20th day of Nov.

1921 John I. Vanarsdall, Judge- " The return on said execution is as follows: No property found in Mercer County. This December 20, 1921. A copy of said execution is filed herewith and made a part hereof and marked "A" for identification. He says that the said sheriff returned the said execution endorsed as aforesaid. He says that the defendant, The *Ohio Valley Fire & Marine Insurance Company* can ~~Alliance Insurance Company~~, of New York, is indebted to the defendant, B.M.Britton, in the sum of \$100.00.
