This day came the Commonwealth by attorney, and the defendant in person and the defendant demanded a Jury for the trial herein, ordered a jury come, and came W. J. Hanna, T. C. Chatham, J. H. Morgan, W. C. Rue, L. R. Whitehouse, and D. R. Bruner, who were duly selected impaneled and sworn, and having heard the evidence of both parties and argument of counsel returned into Court the following verdict "We the jury find the defendant guilty and fix his punishment at \$100.00 fine & fifty days in the workhouse. W. J. Hanna foreman". Wherefore it is adjudged by the Court that the defendant is guilty and that he pay to the Commonwealth, for the use and benefit of City of Harrodsburg the sum of \$100.00 and costs herein, and that he be confined in the Workhouse for a period of fifty days at hard labor. *Upon payment of the fine and costs the workhouse sentence is suspended during the defendant's good behavior*
