The Plaintiffs D. Lee Currey and Leon Morgan state that they are partners under the firm name and style of Currey & Morgan; that the defendant is indebted to them in the sum of \$108.10 for goods and merchandise sold and delivered to him an itemized account of which is made a part hereof; that he has agreed and promised to pay said sum but has failed to do so although it is long past due; that this is an action to recover the amount due on said contract and agreement to pay for said goods; that they believe they should have and recover the full amount of said sum interest and costs; that the defendant has not sufficient property in this State subject to execution to make the amount of said claim and the collection thereof will be endangered by delay in obtaining a judgment and return of no property found.

Wherefore they pray judgment for \$108.10 with interest and costs, for a general order of attachment against the defendant and for all proper relief.
