

Three Hoosiers Are Prisoners

Sergt. James L. Parson, 23, died February 16 of wounds received in North Africa, according to word received by his wife, Mrs. Sybil Parsons, 928 Ellison. Sergeant Parsons, who previously was reported missing, enlisted four years ago and received basic training at Fort Knox. He was sent to Ireland last June. A brother, Sergt. Russell Parsons, also is in the Army.

The War Department made public yesterday the names of six Kentuckians and three Hoosiers who are prisoners of war of Japan. The Kentuckians are Pfc. Harold C. Bailey, son of Mrs. Mar Ida Bailey, Owingsville; Pfc. Grover C. Brummett, son of Joseph Brummett; Pfc. James W. Durr, son of Mrs. Grace Durr; Pfc. Lawrence Martin, son of Charles F. Martin; Pfc. Albert B. Moore, son of Robert Moore, and Pfc. Field M. Reed, husband of Mrs. Joanna C. Reed, all of Harrodsburg.

The Hoosiers are Pfc. Leon F. Atha, Indianapolis; Pvt. Gail J. Kelley, son of Charles F. Kelley, Elwood, and Pfc. Clarence A. Kline, son of Elmus M. Kline, Marion.
